

Professionalism and Civility: All participants, including delegates, advisors, and organizers, are expected to conduct themselves in a professional and civil manner throughout the conference. This includes treating others with respect, refraining from using offensive or derogatory language, and avoiding any behavior that may disrupt the proceedings of the conference.
